How cool is that?!? What a terrific team of worshippers we have at New Hope!

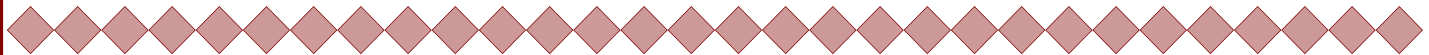

I watched this happen repeatedly and it breaks my heart every time. However, recently I got to experience what it was like when students kept their faith all the way through high school graduation.

Transparency- These students learned that to really grow in Christ, they must be honest in their struggles, and allow the church to walk beside them through it.

Consistency- Prioritizing time at church was essential to keeping them connected to Gods family. Some of these students even scheduled their extra curricular activities around church time.

Life in college land is going to come with it's own learning curve. But I believe that if these three commonalities stay in tact so will their faith. Children's Ministry Sandy Sooter

Hello families,
The children have been doing a great job learning about the Bible in all of our ministry groups. Here is a brief update of what they have been working on.

Our children's church group has just finished a 25 week survey of the Old Testament and are now moving into the New Testament. We recently had a prize week and it is my hope to see these kids regularly on Sundays. We always love having visitors so feel free to bring kids to come and learn about Jesus with us!

Our TeamKid class will be finishing up a full year of curriculum this week. "Going Vertical" was focused on their vertical connection to God and learning about Missions work around the world. We will begin a new year of lessons this month. Our theme will be "Character Challenge" and we will study the Bible while looking at the character of God and talk about what our character should look like. Any 1-6th grade student can join us. We meet from 6:30pm-8:00pm on Wednesday nights in the Children's classroom. TeamKid always includes a strong missions emphasis and I encourage families to try and come. Wednesday nights at church has a bible study group for every age (nursery-adult).

Our Sunday School kids are beginning to learn how to study the Bible independently at home. I sent all of the students home with a SOAP journal. The kids have been asked to read a chapter of the Bible and pick out a verse that stood out to them. After they read the chapter they **S.O.A.P.** the verse. **S - stands for scripture.** The students write the scripture out. **O - stands for observation.** What did they observe about the scripture? **A - stands for application.** How can they apply the scripture to their life? **P - stands for prayer.** Write a prayer to God. It has been a slow start but I am confident that this will allow the children some time at home with God.

Parents, please encourage your children to be reading their Bibles at home. Journaling is a great way to build in Bible study habits and build their faith in God. If you want to do the journal with them - please do. Your spiritual guidance is so important. If you have questions or are new to the Bible that is OK! We can show our kids how to search for answers using prayer, speaking to a Pastor or even looking through internet resources. Our example does not need to be the parent who is all knowing. Our example should be that we are continually growing, loving and learning so be encouraged!

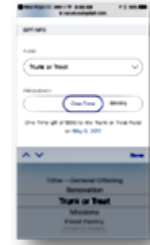
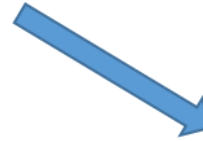
Trunk or Treat

Ok, back to the funeral. At this funeral are a bunch of people who were former members of our church from that time and it brought back a lot of memories that I wished would have remained hidden. I had long ago given all this to God and I had no desire to take it back up again. Then, the next day we come home

to you and your love. There could not have been a greater contrast or a sweeter conclusion.

So, here's the thing: If I had quit all those years ago, *we would never have known your love, care, and acceptance.* What you have given us over the years more than makes up for those early dark years. And on that Sunday you reminded us of every sweet moment that's made it worth it all. You know, 30 years is a long time and we all go through dark experiences. But our dark experiences do not have to define us. In fact, Jesus makes it pretty clear that the parts we are to emulate and to hold onto the tightest are those filled with the people who have loved us the most.

It is amazing how often Christians talk, preach and teach about love without being very loving in their real lives. At New Hope, our brightest moments are when we love not with just words but with our actions.
